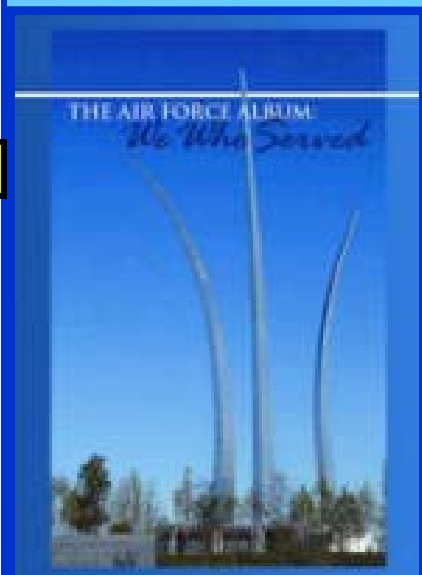

Colonel Wisian has as his mission to usher in the new era of unmanned aircraft, currently the Predator MQ-1, and introduce it along with the flight crews to the Houston area. He is uniquely qualified for the job. He is a Master Navigator and the holder of a PH.D in Geophysics from SMU in Dallas. His Predator Control Centers at Ellington are operational with daily combat missions in Southwestern Asia piloted by the Ellington crews. Ken's background explains in large measure why he was chosen for this job. He graduated from the University of Texas in 1982 and received his commission as a distinguished AFROTC graduate. He became a B-52G Navigator and Radar Navigator at Barksdale AFB and was then selected for the USAF Test Pilot School and became the Chief Test Navigator for the AC-130U Spectre (Spooky) Gunship. Taking time out to pursue his Doctoral degree, he then transferred to the Texas ANG where he has served in operations and command positions prior to assuming command of the 147th. He has over 3800 hours in combat aircraft and combat time in the Balkans, Afghanistan and Iraq. You just can't get more qualified than that. He is married to Dr. Meena Balakrishnan and has one daughter, Danielle.

The Texas Military Forces are proudly creating a historic landmark to commemorate 90 years of Texas Air National Guard members dedicated service. Mounted on a pedestal at Camp Mabry in Austin—forever raised to the sky—the Heritage F-16 will be symbolic of the brave Airmen who served our country in wartime and defended the skies over America.

Formed in 1917 as the 111th Aero Squadron, the 147th Fighter Wing at Houston’s Ellington Field ended 90 years of manned aviation in 2007 to make room for the

MQ-1 Predator and a new mission—the 147th Reconnaissance Wing. Please help us keep alive the spirit behind such an important part of Texas military aviation history.
